The project has received the backing of Bredon Hancocks School, Bredon Playgroup and Bredon Community Play & Recreation. They are all excited for local residents, especially children, to be involved, helping create and maintain these beautiful areas.

Police Report

We would like to make you aware that we have a new member of the team PC Daren Riley. Daren has been a police officer for 18 years, the last 11 years he has been part of the Operational Patrol Unit as an Armed Response Officer. Daren grew up in Worcester and already knows the area well from his patrols; he is looking forward to engaging with the community.

We have had 3 crimes reported in Bredon in April, including three separate reports from the Kemerton Lake Nature Reserve of youths, from Evesham, causing damage over Easter. They removed the warden's boats, stole locks and chains, pulled up route marker posts, destroyed wildlife posters in the hide, lit fires and threw a large amount of litter into the lake. Please be aware that we are working with the Nature Reserve to identify improvements in security as crime prevention and will be putting up signage around the lake.

Kemerton Lake warning

There have been a number of recent incidents at Kemerton Lake Nature Reserve involving teenage children. Safety is everyone's number one priority. Please spread the word that the lake is <u>not safe for swimming</u>. It contains very thick entangling weed, sudden changes in depth & quicksand-mud in places. Entering the water carries a serious risk of drowning.
