

## The Bridge 'without a road'



As you may be aware, Tewkesbury Borough Council is working with Gloucestershire Highways to build a bridge over the railway line behind Sinderberry Drive, connecting fields in Ashchurch to Northway, which in turn will create access for the proposed Garden Town Development creating 10,195 houses.

You may remember that a public consultation to be held at Northway Community Hub had to be cancelled at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic. As a result of this Tewkesbury Borough Council wrote to every household in Northway to give residents an opportunity to comment on the proposals on-line or by phone instead.

The Planning Application for this bridge has now been submitted and this is your ONE opportunity to submit a formal response to it. This needs to have been received at Tewkesbury Borough Council by Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2020, which leaves very little time.

#### Northway Parish Council Corona Virus Response

Like many local organisations and businesses, the Parish Council has had to respond to the current Covid situation to ensure the safety of our employees, councillors and residents who use the Community Hub.

Our focus throughout the pandemic has been to follow Government guidance and protect the residents of Northway by ensuring the Council Offices were safely used. While the Country was in lockdown, we had to close the Community Hub in line with guidance and to ensure we met our priority of safety first. Knowing how much the Hub was used by the community, it wasn't an easy decision to make but it was the right one.

Initially Council meetings were suspended but following a change in legislation our meetings have continued via Zoom so we can facilitate our Parish Council duties and continue to take actions which we hope are for the benefit of Northway. Council meetings continue to be held by Zoom and against the background of the "second wave" this is likely to continue for the foreseeable future.

In line with Government guidance some groups have returned to the Hub. Strict protocols are in place around how people enter and exit the Hub and social distance once inside. Hand sanitisers are provided, and regular cleaning is undertaken, all aimed at minimising risk. Each group has submitted their own risk assessment to the Parish Council which enables us to be reassured they are taking their responsibilities seriously and we have oversight to help ensure the protocols are being followed.

We have decided not to allow private parties at the Hub as we concluded the risk to employees and Northway residents was too high. We will review this position, in line with Government guidance, at the end of the year. The Parish Council remains contactable through the normal ways such as phone and email so please continue to contact us if there is anything you need to report.

Like so many now we find ourselves not in an ideal position but we have adapted to the situation. We continue to operate effectively for our residents, having balanced the risks and benefits for our employees, residents and Councillors. Throughout the pandemic Northway has much to be proud of. Thank you for your continued support and understanding.

The Parish Council would like to say a big thank you for the amazing community response since the pandemic began.

We should all be proud that we have helped our friends and neighbours with shopping, checking that they are ok, chatting to them on the telephone or 2 metres apart over the garden fence.

## YOUR COUNCIL NEEDS YOU

At the time of writing, the Parish Council has two vacancies to be filled by co-option. One further position is also available but the Council is waiting to see if Electors call for an election. In order to be eligible, you must be a British subject or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union and at least 18 years of age and for the previous twelve months either:

- Have been registered as a elector in the Parish
- Have occupied, as owners or tenants, land or premises in the Parish
- Have worked in the Parish or resided in the Parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it.

Some of the recommended skills are decision making, exploring ideas, interpreting information, having ideas, use of imagination, listening, questioning, reviewing, prioritising, seeing the bigger picture-the list goes on. #### New Webpage

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2018 The Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations came into force.
