Queensmead Footway Adoption

There have been quite a lot of residents raising issues with the footways in Queensmead. Councillor Adrian Hardman informed us that the section of footway which runs in front of the houses, along the Main Road, by the large section of grass, has been adopted by Worcestershire County Council. It is likely that any maintenance work will not occur until the next financial year.

The County Council will be resurfacing the section of footway by the entrance to Queensmead, as you enter the estate from Cheltenham Road, next year as well.


Bredon's Norton Drainage Issues

Bridge to Nowhere - Increased Traffic

Tewkesbury Borough Council has submitted its own planning application to build a new bridge over the railway north of Northway in the area marked red on the map. The purpose of the bridge is to unlock land north of Ashchurch Camp for 1000+ houses, by removing safety objections to the existing crossing. However, funding for connecting roads has not been secured and there is a significant likelihood that a large amount public money will be spent on a 'Bridge to Nowhere'

The Parish Council strongly objects to the proposal on highway safety, road congestion and landscape grounds. Traffic from the new development will either add to the dangerous congestion on the A46 at Ashchurch, or else be channelled through the severely restricted roads in Bredon and neighbouring villages. The new bridge will be the height of 3 double decker buses and will be an eyesore from the AONB.
