Police Update from West Mercia

We are working hard to tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB) in Bredon. Following reports of criminal damage and ASB, we have and are taking action to identify the offenders and are working closely with the Parish Council and other agencies to address the issue.

Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of unacceptable activity that causes harm to an individual, to their community, or to their environment. This could be an action by someone else that leaves you feeling alarmed, harassed or distressed. It also includes fear of crime, or concern for public safety, public disorder or public nuisance.

Examples of anti-social behaviour include:

- Nuisance, rowdy or inconsiderate neighbours; Vandalism, graffiti and fly-posting; Street drinking;
- Environmental damage including littering, dumping of rubbish and abandonment of cars
- Firework misuse; Inconsiderate or inappropriate use of vehicles

If you are experiencing problems with anti-social behaviour, or have any concerns about it, or other community safety issues, you should contact the Parish Council or report this to us online. In an emergency, if you or your property are at risk or a crime is in progress call 999.
